### FIRST AID AND DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING

Thanks to a generous donation, we now have a defibrillator. Once in place, it will be accessible to anyone in the community whenever the church is open.

We're pleased to share two of our team members, Fabienne and Sam, recently attended a full-day First Aid training session with Millie's Trust. Building on this, we arranged a Red Cross training session the following week for volunteers and we were delighted that 10 joined the session.



We're proud to say that everyone who participated in the training now feels confident in using the defibrillator—a big step forward in ensuring we can respond effectively in emergencies.

## Christmas leftovers Bubble and Squeak

#### INGREDIENTS

200g cooked turkey, shredded 200g roasted potatoes Any leftover vegetables 1 egg Oil Salt

METHOD Chop potatoes and veg into chunks add to turkey.

Season well then add 1 whisked egg.

Shape into round shapes (using wet hands will prevent them sticking).

Heat oil (or leftover goose fat) in a frying pan.

Fry for 2-3 minutes on each side - listen out for the bubble and squeak noises.

TIPS

Jamie Oliver serves his with a poached egg on top.

Gordan Ramsey suggests if you are vegetarian or vegan why not try with chunks of feta or sundried tomatoes.

Joe Wicks (Lean in 15 author) uses coconut oil instead of oil or butter.
